

All students who are present on Friday, September 18th will be given the opportunity to take home with them 3 days of breakfast and lunch. These meals will be distributed at the very end of the day and will be sent home with a frozen water bottle and frozen juices to serve as cold packs. These meals should keep at a safe temperature within 2 hours of distribution. Please put these convenient meal items in the refrigerator or freezer ASAP upon returning home. These meals are intended to make up for the Wednesday out of school, as well as, cover the weekend. This Seamless Summer Option is being made available thru the USDA thru December 2020 or until further notice.

We will gladly serve all children breakfast and lunch while they are attending classes in person, and we strongly encourage ALL students to participate in this take home opportunity, as well. Please encourage your student to take advantage of these benefits. If for some reason you wish your child not to participate in this take home opportunity, please notify the school.

Distant learners will continue to be served during this time, as well, but will receive 7 days of breakfast and lunch. Distance learners can continue their one day pick up of meals on Wednesdays from 9-10am at the requested school until further notice. This distribution will start Wednesday, September 16th.

All of these options are intended only for students who are enrolled in UCPS and help the funding of the school nutrition program. We greatly appreciate your support and participation. Thank you!!
